

# THE END DAYS

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## Never accept a cross, which does not resemble the Cross upon which I was crucified (855 07-30-13)

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(Note: The words are from Our Lord Jesus Christ to *Maria Divine Mercy*, unless otherwise indicated. References: The first number is the order of the messages, the last three pairs of numbers are dates of the messages in month, day, year)

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
In this piece, I'm going to show three crosses (attached images below), one of them is the official cross worn by Francis on his neck, and two others he presented to the public. The 3-inch official cross I bought from Gifts Catholic Inc. online. It shows a shepherd carrying on his shoulder one of the sheep. He is surrounded by numerous other sheep. Another cross he held in his hand when he showed it to the cardinals contains something like a bird having wings but its head is not that of a bird. Someone calls it the "beast cross". Still another cross he faced when he read the scriptures comprising of two horizontal curve bars of opposite curvature: one concave (painted white with a fish image on it) and one convex (painted dark blue with a fish image). Someone calls it the "yin-yang cross". But none of them shows Our Lord crucified. Apparently, the motivation here is to please pagans by demonstrating that their idols and religious symbols are acceptable to the Catholic Church and to familiarize the Catholics with these desecrating "crucifix" crosses.

Replacing the crucifix cross with any without Jesus's Corpus implies the denial of the redemption of the world by our Lord and that there was no actual crucifixion of our Lord two thousand years ago. If there were no redemption, then there was no need for original sin and personal sins to be forgiven and for the person to be redeemed. In that case, there is no need for people to be baptized and they will still be saved. This throws out the *de fide* dogmas of the Holy Roman Catholic Church: "Membership of the Church is necessary for all men for salvation." (Dr. Ludwig Ott, *Fundamentals of Catholic Dogma*, Tan Books, 1960, p. 312); and "Baptism by water is, since the promulgation of the Gospel, necessary for all men without exception, for salvation." (Dr. Ludwig Ott, *ibid.* p. 356). The Church affirms that for believers the sacraments of the New Covenant are *necessary for salvation*. (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1129).

## Francis Ying Yang Cross

Francis needs to attract the pagan Eastern religion of Buddhism and the like. Here is his new Ying Yang Cross (as compared to his [Beast Cross](#)).



Here is a simple graphic showing the comparison with a Ying Yang.

The introduction of the crosses is the first step in the plan to embrace all pagan and non-Christian religions in the new One-World Religion in which there is no sin, and all people will be saved regardless of their faith or works. Thus, from our Lord's command (attached message), never accept these crosses.

But that's not all. Francis' stated in his interview with Eugenio Scalfari, which took place on September 24, 2013 at the Vatican residence of Santa Marta and which was published in "la Repubblica", the leading secular Italian newspaper, on October 1, 2013:

*“And I believe in God, not in a Catholic God, there is no Catholic God, there is God and I believe in Jesus Christ, his incarnation. Jesus is my teacher and my pastor, but God, the Father, Abba, is the light and the Creator. This is my Being. Do you think we are very far apart?”*

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains why the Church of Christ has been named Catholic: "The Church is catholic: she proclaims the fullness of the faith. She bears in herself and administers the totality of the means of salvation. She is sent out to all peoples. She speaks to all men. She encompasses all times. She is 'missionary of her very nature'" (no. 868). Only the Catholic Church is "the Church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth" (1 Timothy 3: 15) because she possesses the fullness of faith and totality of the means of salvation. Since God is the Truth, God must necessarily be the Catholic God. A God who is not Catholic is not God at all, because he is not the Truth. Thus a *de fide* dogma of the Catholic Church is: "The Church founded by Christ is catholic." (Dr. Ludwig Ott, *ibid.*, p. 306). (Note: a *de fide* dogma is an immediately revealed truth defined by a Pope *ex cathedra* [from the Chair of Peter] must be believed by all to be saved).

Jesus Christ is the Head of the Holy Roman Catholic Church (Ephesian 5: 22), But Jesus is God, therefore God is necessarily Catholic. Take a non-Catholic religion such as Islam where words of Allah (Islam's God) are claimed to be written in the book of Koran (Qur'an). This book denies that Jesus is the Son of God and therefore God. (Qur'an: Maryam 19:34-38). Koran says Jesus is only a prophet among many others (Qur'an: Sura 2:136; 3:84). But the true Godhead is the Holy Trinity. When a non-Catholic "God" does not consist of the Holy Trinity, then he cannot be the true God since the true God cannot deny Himself, i.e. He cannot deny His Only-Begotten Son. Therefore, Allah cannot be God. Can a Catholic, who believes in a non-Catholic "God" and denies his own true God, remain a Catholic?

Let's take a closer look at Francis's remaining statement: "*Jesus is my teacher and my pastor, but God, the Father, Abba, is the light and the Creator.*" The word "but" means a contrast between Jesus, a man, and God the Father, the Creator. "*This is my Being.*" In philosophical discourse "**Being**" (with B in upper case) refers to **God** (see Etienne Gilson, *The Elements of Christian Philosophy*, Mentor-Omega Book, 1960, "**God is Being**", p. 135). The term "**being**" (with lower case b) refers to **creatures**. The word "This" could mean either Jesus or God the Father, i.e. either "Jesus is my God" or "God the Father is my God". To determine which of the two, we need the next sentence. "*Do you think we are very far apart?*" The pronoun "we" may refer to Jesus and Francis, or God the Father and Francis. Assuming that Francis is not claiming himself to be God, i.e. He and God the Father are very far apart, then "we" only refers to Jesus and Francis. Since Jesus and Francis are not far apart, it necessarily means that Jesus is a man only. This meaning is strengthened by the word "but" which emphasizes the difference in substance between God the Father and Jesus. Thus, Francis not only denies God (i.e. Catholic God) but also denies Jesus Christ to be God as well. It seems that Francis approves the Arian heresy. But this is only the beginning. There is more to come.

Our Lord says: "**Look behind the words, which will be carefully constructed and you will detect the lie.**" (833 07-07-13 ). This is what we are doing.

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
